#### **Program/Workshop Descriptions**

## Exercise Design - Workshop

Methodical process examining foundation pieces needed prior to an exercise. Participants who would like to design their own exercise, will start the process through the use of needs assessment, objective setting, checklists and scenario creation.

## Situational Awareness Specialist

Certification program designed to educate in the discipline of situational awareness, creating a security awareness practitioner capable of understanding and dealing with the dynamics of random and potentially threatening events.

## Applied Verbal De-escalation Specialist

Certificate program in applied verbal de-escalation. Including a Role-play component to ensure comprehension of material. De-escalation employs verbal and nonverbal techniques to better manage a situation without having to potentially engage in a physical altercation.

#### Crisis Communications

Shawna teaches participants the importance of clear and concise messaging before during and after a Crisis. Learn to fashion direct key messaging to ensure accurate information is collected and dispersed when it is needed most.
